Weekly Maths Tasks Aim to do 1 per day	Weekly Reading Tasks Aim to do a range of these through the week
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work on TT Rockstars TTRockstars • Play on Hit the Button - focus on times tables, division facts and squared numbers. Hit the Button • Daily arithmetic for different areas of maths. Your child should aim to work on level 4, 5 and 6 activities. Focus on the fractions this week. Daily Arithmetic • SAT Style reasoning questions • Ask your child to show everything they know about fractions on a piece of paper. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. Get them to be as creative as they want to be. • Fraction Matching Game Play this matching game- the mixed numbers level is a greater challenge. • Maths Puzzles This booklet provides maths problems aimed at getting children really thinking. The problems were originally released as challenge cards to stretch children, so it may be worth starting with some of the Year 3/4 problems before attempting some of the Year 5/6 ones! The booklet contains all problems for the whole primary phase and answers at the end. Choose a couple of problems a day. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep going with daily reading- it is so important. • Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library • Your child can log on to Bug Club/Oxford Owl for free during the closure period and read a book that matches their book band. After this, direct your child to review the text and justify their opinion with examples from the text. https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/home/find-a-book/library-page/ • Encourage your child to turn their 'reading record book' into a reading diary. Ask them to jot down a few things about what they've read in the diary to share with us when they're back in school. They could note down a small overview of what happened in each chapter/ any information they find out reading online etc. • Reading Plus (All of year 6 plus some of Year 5 can access this online) • Maya Creation Story Sign up to Twinkl for the school closure period using the link and offer code in the 'Additional Learning Resources' box on the last page of this planning pack. Download the comprehension and complete the questions.



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage your child to practise the Year 5/ 6 Spelling Words. Children are expected to be able to spell all words on the Year 3/4 list and the Year 5/6 list by the end of year 6. You can find the Y3/4 list on pg 16 of this link and the Y5/6 list on pg 23. Spelling Lists • Then ask your child to choose 5 Common Exception words. They can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Word hippo online is great for this. https://www.wordhippo.com/ • Practise spellings on Spelling Frame (practise tests/ spelling tiles free to use) https://spellingframe.co.uk/user/register • Proof read any writing from this week. Can you choose three sentences from within one of your pieces and improve them? Think about varying the sentence starter (fronted adverbial, simile opener, ed opener, ing opener). Choose 5 spellings to check and correct OR choose 5 words to improve using a thesaurus. (Word hippo is great for this) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write another diary entry (you could use the exercise book that you have been sent from school with to do this). One day this could become a valuable historical source! You could use Newsround to help you understand what is happening. You might want to answer the following questions in their diaries- What is daily life like? How is it different to normal? How do you feel? What are you doing to communicate with others in the outside world? Try to update this at least once each week. • I don't want to go to school poem Watch the poem on youtube. Think how many times we've felt like the poet! Right now I'd love to be in school. Attempt to write your own poem from a different perspective- Call your poem: <u>I want to go to school today</u>. You could try to follow the pattern of the original poem or you could write a poem listing all the things you would be doing if we were in school. • Think of the fairytale of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. Write a diary entry from the point of view of Goldilocks. Explain why she did what she did, give her a 'back story', why did she need to go into the house that day? • Next write a diary entry from one of the Bear's points of views. How awful was it coming home to find someone in your house? How did you feel? • Points of View Challenge Login to your twinkl account and then click the link above. Read the different points of view challenge cards. Discuss the scenarios with your adult. Choose one scenario and write about it from the other character's point of view. (Don't worry about the third/ first person instruction!)


Learning Project

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about different viewpoints. Learning may focus on physical viewpoints in terms of what you can see outside of the window at home, what others can see looking into your home and then progress onto personal viewpoints and of others.

- **Capture the world from different viewpoints** Look out of your front room window, sketch the view you can see. Go to a window at the back of the house and sketch what you can see through this window. You could change the styles of these drawings- one could be very realistic and one could be a cartoon style?



- **History-Points of View WW1 Causes** Use BBC bitesize to research the causes of WW1. Make an information poster showing your research. Your poster could include subheadings, bullet points, brackets (to add extra information), illustrations, labelled diagrams, make it attractive to the reader.



- **Zentangle skyline** Get creative and make a picture with a different look. Zentangles are a great doodle-art style. Watch this video and play around designing your own patterns [Zentangle Patterns](#)
After you could create a skyline picture for a city using zentangle patterns to decorate.
