- Look at a [map of the UK](#). Find where you live and places you have been to. Have you been to any of the different UK countries?
- Make your own [map of the UK](#) . Colour and label the different countries. Mark on any places you have visited or been to on holiday.
- Imagine you are packing for a holiday. Draw a picture of a suitcase in the middle of your paper. Around the outside of the case, write or draw all the things you would need to take on your holiday. Would your packing be the same if you were going to a hot country or a cold country?

Weekly Challenge – Art (Mrs Simpkins)

This week I am setting you an art challenge. I want you to make a portrait of someone in your family. A portrait is a picture of someone usually showing their head, neck and shoulders.
