

Curriculum

Knowledge Organisers were shared with you, as parents, for the first time for Autumn 2 half term (Nov-Dec). We will do the same for Spring 1 onwards. These are formed following lots of shared planning and moderation between class teachers and subject leaders.

Our new geography curriculum allowed us to widen the field trips on offer, with visits to Avenham Park and Heysham new aspects of this updated syllabus. Pupils will take part in the same field trip driven approach this year.

Our use of White Rose Maths has gone from strength-to-strength, with pupils taught through a range of consistent models and vocabulary. We have a 3-yearly average of 81% pupils achieving expected standard by the end of Year 6 (significantly above national averages).

EYFS

We only have one EYFS class running this year but have begun to refresh our resources and have adjusted the internal area. Our new fences should allow us to develop the outdoor space and (fingers crossed) our bid will be accepted for a new roof!

Inclusion

Updated TLPs and Support Plans are now available for pupils with SEND. Our parent drop-in sessions have been well received and allow for a more detailed conversations about pupils with SEND. During our recent OFSTED, the overwhelmingly positive feedback from pupils and parents with regards inclusion and SEND was a further indicator of our strong work in developing this area.

Mrs Evans has now returned full-time to continue, alongside Karen and the rest of the staff team, the development in this area.

Behaviour

We are now a Trauma Informed School, using this knowledge to develop behaviour which encourages individuals to take responsibility and follow the Moss Side Way, through an approach characterised by empathy and restorative approaches – pupils understand their own and others' emotions, as well as knowing how to handle a situation differently last time.

EYFS events such as Eat Lunch with Your Child and our Easter activities were well attended in 23/24.

The School Council are well on their way to developing our Trim Trails, supported by your fundraising support.

Personal Development

We have ensured that there is a wider number of sports clubs at KS1 and are looking to widen this further this year, once budgets are confirmed. For a 4th year, we achieved Gold in School Games, which recognises the significant breadth and depth of our offer. Alongside this, Young Voices, brass, guitar and coding were offered to our Junior pupils (alongside the wide range of activities within school time).

Our 'pathway' has taken shape and we are hopefully that our draft version will be available shortly for you to provide feedback on.
